

Waterways across the Baltic Sea: Scandlines schedules 2009

All information on routes, offers and pricelists / New: Individual national schedules for Denmark, Sweden, Latvia and the Island of Bornholm

Scandlines is now making it even easier to plan a journey by ferry: handy national timetables for Denmark, Sweden, Latvia and the Island of Bornholm replace the previous overall schedule in 2009. Holidaymakers can make a targeted decision for their favourite destination and receive all the important information on departure times, offers and prices in a clear and compact manner. In addition, combined tickets for different routes enable both economical and flexible travel. Scandlines operates a total of eight ferry services between Germany, Denmark and Sweden, as well as to the Baltic States and Finland.

The quickest way for holidaymakers to reach Denmark is via the "VogelflugLine" between Puttgarden and Rødby. A single journey can be booked from a price of just € 64 at the standard rate. The routes of the wide-ranging Scandlines route network can also be combined with each other in a convenient way. For the Puttgarden-Rødby and Rostock-Gedser lines, Scandlines offers discounted through tickets to Sweden in combination with the Helsingør-Helsingborg route.

A single standard ticket for a car up to 6 metres long and up to 9 people from Germany to Sweden can be purchased from just € 97.

Scandlines' direct routes to Sweden are the Rostock-Trelleborg service (standard ticket from € 119 per car up to 6 m long, including a maximum of 9 persons) or the shortest crossing to Sweden via Sassnitz-Trelleborg (standard ticket from € 109 per car up to 6 m long, including a maximum of 9 persons).

Scandlines also offers a "Network Card" for frequent travellers. Customers can use this on all Scandlines routes between Germany, Denmark and Sweden, as well as on the Helsingør-Helsingborg service. Using the principle of a charge card, the Network Card can be repeatedly topped up with an amount of € 800 and gives the user price benefits on a large number of lines. The "Exclusive Card" and the "Go Green Card" also provide route-related price advantages.

Scandlines has the general agency for the shipping line, BornholmsTrafikken, in relation to the service between Sassnitz and Rønne. You can also get to Denmark's sunshine island via the Scandlines routes from Germany to Denmark or Sweden via the routes to Bornholm from Køge (DK) and Ystad (S).

Overview of Scandlines routes from Germany:

Puttgarden – Rødby (DK) (daily every 30 minutes, crossing time 45 minutes)
Rostock – Gedser (DK) (daily every 2 hours, crossing time 1 hour 45 minutes)
Rostock – Trelleborg (S) (up to three times daily, crossing time (daytime) 5 hours 45 minutes, (night time) 7 hours 30 minutes)
Sassnitz – Trelleborg (S) (up to five times daily, crossing time 4 hours)
Rostock – Ventspils (LV) (four times per week, crossing time 28 hours)
